Monday Assembly

This week, our assemblies focused on how small actions can make a big difference. In the lower school, children heard the story *The Blue Giant*, where a young girl helps improve her local seaside environment. In the upper school, children learned about Boyan Slat, the Dutch inventor behind *The Ocean Cleanup*, a project designed to remove rubbish from oceans and prevent plastic entering rivers and seas.

Both assemblies explored how large problems can often feel overwhelming but that small ideas and actions can grow into something much more powerful. The children shared thoughtful ideas about how we can reduce pollution and litter both in school and within our local community. These are wonderful conversations to continue at home.

Governors in School

This week, our governors have found many reasons to visit LEPS. On Monday, one of our governors joined our assemblies and spoke with children about British Values at Little Ealing. On Wednesday, governors met to discuss the governing board structure for the next academic year. Today, a group of governors met with the Junior Leadership Team to hear about their work this year to develop our lunchtime provision and to understand the positive impact this has had on behaviour, inclusion and play.

Assessment and Reports

We have been busy assessing our Year 1 children as part of the national Phonics Screening Check this week. The children have approached this with confidence and positivity - we are very proud of them.

At the same time, staff have been working hard behind the scenes on end-of-year reports. There is not long to wait now before these are shared with families, providing an opportunity to celebrate the progress, achievements and successes of the year.

Help your child feel heard

Children are more likely to follow our rules when they feel we are listening to them. It can be hard right now especially if people are at home together, or it all feels too hectic however, taking a moment to listen to your child will really model how they respond and react to you. Sometimes its good to think what its like when us as adults are not heard or listened too, how does that make you feel? This might be how your child feels.

How can parents help? Acknowledge what your child is asking for, even if your answer is 'no'. For example: "I hear you. You are saying it loud and clear - NO BATH! You really do not want to have a bath! Tonight, you do need to have one, though... Which do you choose- a bath or a shower?" Offering a choice to your child can be really powerful because they feel they have some control, even if it's small.

Sometimes we could all do with someone to talk to.
