Keeping Children Safe on Roblox: Important Information for Parents and Carers

We would like to remind all parents and carers about the importance of online safety, particularly when children are using platforms such as Roblox.

Roblox is a popular online platform made up of a wide variety of games created by users. Children can both play games and create their own. While it is free to download, there are optional in-game purchases and subscription features available. Roblox can be accessed across multiple devices, making it widely available to children.

Recently, some children have reported receiving messages from people they do not know while using the chat function. This highlights the importance of staying vigilant and ensuring appropriate safety measures are in place.

What should I be aware of?

User-generated content

Because much of the content on Roblox is created by users, not all games will be suitable for children. Content is labelled by type rather than age, using categories such as Minimal, Mild, Moderate, and Restricted. It is important to regularly check what your child is playing.

Chat features

Roblox includes a chat facility where players can communicate with others. Although some restrictions apply to users under 13, children may still encounter messages from strangers. Parents can:

- Turn off chat completely
- Restrict communication to approved friends only

Virtual currency (Robux)

Players can purchase Robux to buy in-game items, upgrades, or accessories. Setting spending controls can help manage this.

Age guidance

Roblox has a PEGI Parental Guidance rating due to the wide range of user-generated content. This means parental involvement is strongly recommended.

How can I keep my child safe?

- Set up and regularly review parental controls
- Monitor the games your child is accessing
- Check privacy and communication settings
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Encourage your child to only interact with people they know in real life.
