Last week was an incredibly busy and successful week for sport across the school!

We kicked things off on Monday with our Year 3 and 4 football league campaign. The team made a brilliant start, winning five games and drawing one. Their teamwork, determination and enthusiasm were fantastic to see an excellent opening to the week.

On Tuesday, our Year 5 and 6 pupils headed to the London Youth Games athletics finals. It was a gruelling day of competition, with every child giving their absolute best. Their hard work paid off as they achieved an outstanding second place overall, earning silver medals. This was a massive achievement, and we are incredibly proud of every single one of them.



Thursday was another action-packed day with two teams competing. Our netball squad also took part in the London Youth Games, progressing confidently through to the second round before narrowly missing out on further progression on goal difference. The girls showed great resilience and sportsmanship throughout, and we are very proud of their efforts.



At the same time, our NFL team competed in the West London regional tournament, facing 12 schools for a place in the London finals this May. Little Ealing delivered a flawless performance winning all six of their games and being crowned overall champions! We are excited to see them represent the school at the London qualifiers.

To round off the week, Friday saw two of our teams compete in the regional basketball competition. Both teams performed brilliantly and, in an unusual twist, met each other in the quarter-finals. One team progressed and went on to win all their remaining matches, becoming overall basketball champions! We look forward to them competing in the London finals later in the year.

Computing News at LEPS

Year 4's Google Slides Adventure

This half term in Computing, Year 4 have been learning how to create presentations using Google Slides. The children have really enjoyed developing their presentation skills and exploring different ways to make their slides clear, creative and engaging.

They began by learning how to create eye-catching title slides and organise information carefully on content slides. The children also practised finding suitable images and GIFs to support their ideas and learned how to import them into their presentations.

As their confidence grew, they explored more advanced features such as making an image into a slide background, adding animations to objects and using slide transitions to make their presentations more dynamic.

We also discussed the importance of keeping slides simple so that the audience stays focused and interested. The children learned that too many pictures or too much text can make a presentation difficult to follow. To help with this, they were introduced to the 3 bullet point rule: remembering that each slide should contain no more than three bullet points to present key information clearly.

It has been wonderful to see the children applying these skills with such enthusiasm and creativity. Great job to all Year 4 pupils!
