#### Monday Assembly

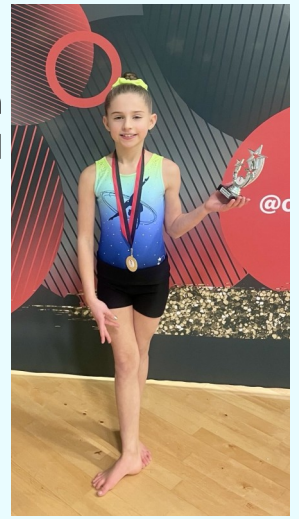

- Smile and enjoy it!

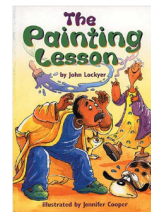

They've also transformed the Reading Shed into an even more inviting space with beloved characters decorating every corner. The Reading Shed is one of the fun new zones for lunch-time breaks.

## Computing News at LEPS

### Year 5 Set Sail with Scratch!

This half term in Computing, Year 5 have been learning how to use Scratch, a block-based coding programme that helps children develop programming skills in a visual and engaging way. Scratch allows pupils to create games, animations and interactive projects by joining code blocks together, helping them to understand key coding concepts such as sequencing, repetition, selection and debugging. It also encourages children to think logically, test ideas and make improvements when something does not work as expected.

As part of their work, the children created a boat racing game, where they programmed a boat to move around the screen using mouse control. They used code to detect when the boat touched obstacles or reached the finish line, helping them understand how different blocks work together to make a game interactive. Throughout the project, pupils developed their problem-solving skills by carefully testing and adjusting their code to improve how their game worked.

Once the main game was complete, the children particularly enjoyed adding their own creative touches, including changing sprites, backgrounds and sounds to personalise their projects. Some also experimented with altering the speed of the boat or adding extra challenges to make their games unique and more exciting.

The Year 5 classes thoroughly enjoyed these lessons and showed great enthusiasm for programming throughout the unit. Scratch continues to be an excellent tool for KS2 children, giving them the confidence to experiment, solve problems and bring their ideas to life through code in a creative and accessible way.
