A MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear all

What a week! The water crisis has certainly kept us busy – thank you all for your patience and understanding while we worked through it together. Despite the challenges, the children have continued to impress us with their resilience and positivity.

The Water Situation – an update

Despite the tremendous efforts of staff throughout this challenging week, the water situation has unfortunately not improved. Our team has worked tirelessly to keep the school running as smoothly as possible, and I am deeply grateful for the patience, kindness and understanding so many of you have shown. Your support has been a powerful reminder of the strength and care within our school community.

I know there has been some confusion about the use of the water you have kindly been bringing in, so I would like to clarify. The water donated by families is being used to refill the toilets and handwashing stations. This, in turn, has allowed us to preserve the limited mains supply and unopened bottled water for all food-related purposes - cooking, rinsing produce, dishwashing and drinking. Without your contributions, we simply would not have been able to remain open this week.

The situation remains as follows:

- **Long-term solution:** We are in a queue for a new water supply connection. This work is expected to take three to four months before it can even begin. Once scheduled, we will share the dates and timeframe with you. Clearly, it is not feasible to continue managing the school in the same way for this length of time. Staff have gone above and beyond, but this is not sustainable. The Local Authority has recognised this and commissioned a contractor to investigate and implement a short-term solution.
- **Short-term plan:** I was informed last night that contractors will be on site this afternoon and working over the weekend. Their aim is to put measures in place that will allow us to open again on Monday.

Thank you again for your continued support and understanding as we work through this very difficult situation together.

Weekly Assembly

This week, some of our Year 5 and 6 children helped to deliver our assembly. They introduced our upcoming School Street Launch and reminded us all what makes a healthy street and how we can keep active. Together, we talked about how fewer cars outside our school will make our roads safer, quieter, and cleaner.

The children also led the whole school in a road safety chant – **STOP, LOOK, LISTEN and THINK!** – and our Year 5s shared what they had learnt last year

about air quality through their pollution experiments.

We ended the assembly with a reminder about the **School Streets Launch Day on Monday 22nd September. Our School Street will mean that Weymouth Avenue and Hereford Road are closed to most vehicles (but not all hence the clear Road Safety Messages) at school drop off and pick up times.**

To celebrate the launch of our School Street and the safer, quieter journeys it will bring, we have a special day planned:

- **Giant Meet Up and Walk** – Families are invited to meet us at Blondin Park at 8.00am to walk to school together in convoy. You will find Miss Caldwell inside the park near to the Windmill Road entrance and she will lead the way to school – setting off at 8.10am.
- **Dress to Shine** – Children are encouraged to wear bright, colourful, or sparkly clothes to mark the occasion.

We look forward to seeing many of you there!

Schools Counselling Partnership

We are delighted to share some news about a new initiative at Little Ealing. In partnership with the John Lyons Charity, the school has invested in the Schools Counselling Partnership, a therapeutic service that we will benefit from for the next three years.

This week, we welcomed **Elita, our Therapeutic Lead**, and **Kathryn, our Therapist**, who spent time onsite getting to know the school. From now on, they will be with us every Wednesday, working from a dedicated therapy space that the school has created for this purpose.

We are really looking forward to seeing how this new service will complement the work we already do at Little Ealing to support both children and families. The Schools Counselling Partnership provides specialist support that will enable us to further promote the wellbeing, resilience and emotional development of our pupils.

Below, you will find further information about the **Schools Counselling Partnership**, which introduces their work and explains how you can access their support directly. In addition to self-referrals, the school will also be referring children to the service where appropriate. Should this be the case, **Elita will be in contact with you** before any therapeutic work begins, to ensure you are fully informed and involved.

We are excited about the positive impact this partnership will bring to our community, and we look forward to working closely with Elita and Kathryn in the months and years ahead.

Back to School

- Water issues aside - it has been a positive start to the autumn term with well being activities supporting all pupils and a staggered start for Nursery and Reception
- There was a good turnout for the Class Meetings
- Changing the morning routines has been really well received and supporting a good start to the morning for many of our children and families
- ClassDojo is up and running - please make sure you are connected so we can communicate messages to the classes and whole school community
- Reminder of the School Street launch on Monday 22nd September
- The school has invested in scooter racks and we will let you know when they are installed and ready for us to use

Reflections on Last Year

- New headteacher - ending the year with a clear picture of the schools strengths and areas to develop this year
- ClassDojo was introduced as a parent-school link and will be developed further this year
- Specialist teachers continued to add value to our curriculum offer and enhance opportunities in language, sports and PE - this year a new computing specialist joins our team to support our vision of developing our curriculum
- Premises improvements were vast and have supported the enhancement of the learning environments for pupils and staff
- Following feedback from the parent questionnaire in 2023 - 2024 - the school carried out a full SEND Review to identify and work on - How pupils who have a Special Educational or Disability (SEND) are supported? And how this is communicated to parents? This work is not finished but in just a year we made some important improvements and developments

Parent & Pupil Feedback

The school was thrilled with the results of the parent questionnaires last year with high satisfaction levels: 94%+ in areas like happiness, safety, progress, leadership, subject range and recommendation.

- 94% - My child is happy at LEPS
- 97% - My child feels safe at LEPS
- 96% - My child is making progress at LEPS
- 91% - I am aware of what my child is learning
- 94% - LEPS is well led and managed
- 95% - There is a good range of subjects
- 92% - LEPS supports my child's wider personal development
- 96% I would recommend Little Ealing to another parent

• Areas for improvement that were identified and in line with the school development plan were:

- 88% agreed pupils are well behaved (3% unsure)
- 74% felt the school has high expectations (9% unsure)

The school will be looking at strengthen both of these areas as they continue to review and adapt the curriculum this year.

Dear Parents and Carers,

Earlier this year we asked for your views on the proposal to implement a School Street around your school. After an evaluation of the feedback from the local and school community, and careful consideration of the far-reaching benefits of School Streets, we can confirm we will be going ahead with the scheme at Little Ealing Primary School.

You may recall that we asked stakeholders to let us know any compelling reasons why we should not proceed with the scheme. It should be noted that this engagement was not a referendum on the scheme, and a majority indicating support would not automatically overrule a compelling reason not to proceed, if one were identified. Conversely, a majority indicating that they don't support the proposal would not automatically overrule the Council's ambition to proceed with the scheme in the absence of a compelling reason.

No compelling reasons were identified that cannot be resolved.

This is a council led initiative. The school have supported the council by facilitating activities and disseminating materials to the school community, as part of our usual engagement process.

The School Street for your school will start 22 September 2025. The closure times are Monday to Friday, between 8.15 to 9.00am and 2.30 to 3.45pm, and will operate during term time only, according to the term dates published on Ealing Council's website. It will still operate on individual school training and occasional days: www.ealing.gov.uk/term-dates

What is a School Street and why is it important?

A School Street is where the roads leading to school gates are closed to most traffic for a set time, at the start and end of the school day. It maintains access for residents living at properties within the designated Pedestrian and Cycle Zone.

School Streets help children feel safer on their school journey, they increase walking, scooting and cycling and improve air quality by reducing congestion outside schools at peak times.

With fewer vehicles accessing the roads around the school, the street will be calmer, safer and quieter for everyone.



Who will be allowed to drive into the street?

- Only School Street permit holders will have access to the road during the timed closure.
- Residents living within zone.
- Blue Badge holders requiring access to the school. *

No parents or carers will be allowed to drive down the road during operational times unless they have a permit because they are residents, Blue Badge holders, or need access for a child that has a Blue Badge *

What will the School Street look like?

- At the entry points, there will be signs saying the road is a Pedestrian and Cycle Zone, stating the timings of the closure.
- We will place advanced warning signs on the approach to the zone.
- There will be Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras.
- There will be less traffic, making it quieter, safer and more welcoming for all who use it
- Fines will be issued to those that do not have a permit.

Where is my School Street?

The roads included in your School Street are Weymouth Avenue from Little Ealing Lane to its junction with Bramley Road/Airedale Road, the whole of Hereford Road and Temple Road from its junction with Netherbury Road to Weymouth Avenue.

You must not enter this area in a motor vehicle Monday to Friday, between 8.15 to 9.00am and 2.30 to 3.45pm unless you are a School Street permit holder. We encourage you to walk, scoot or cycle to school or 'park and stride' (park 10 minutes away and walk from there).

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The streets will be **LOW** traffic not **NO** traffic, therefore road safety is very important for adults and children. Everyone must be alert at all times, not walk in the road, always use the pavement, look out for cars and cyclists, and cross the roads safely.

Look out for information from your school on the activities and events they are organising for the launch of your School Street.
